- The classes will be conducted 2 days a week for 8 hours each and 1 day a week for 4 hours.
- Plus, students will need to attend additional 25 hours practice time in the automotive workshop per term.
- Students will also need to put in approximately 8 hours per week towards self-paced learning and assessment.

*All students are required to participate in **Workshop Safety Training** at the commencement of their course. This training provides students with essential safety knowledge and practical skills relevant to the workshop environment. Students must successfully complete and be assessed as competent in workshop safety requirements before being permitted to undertake any further training or assessment activities in the workshop.*

AUR30620 - Certificate III in Light Vehicle Mechanical Technology

Qualification description

This course is for people working in the automotive industry who want a career as an automotive light vehicle mechanic. Students will learn how to service, repair and diagnose faults in motor vehicles weighing up to 4.5 tonnes. Students will learn how to diagnose service and repair faults in light vehicle engine, transmission, suspension, steering, brake and electrical systems and components

Course Duration

- This qualification will be delivered over 52 weeks including 12 weeks of break.
- The classes will be conducted 2 days a week for 8 hours each and 1 day a week for 4 hours.
- Plus, students will need to attend additional 25 hours practice time in the automotive workshop per term.
- Students will also need to put in approximately 8 hours per week towards self-paced learning and assessment.

This training provides students with essential safety knowledge and practical skills relevant to the workshop environment. 

Course Duration

- The program delivery will be scheduled over approximate 36 weeks including 6 weeks of break.
- 8 hours per day for 2 days a week and 4 hours for 1 day a week.
- Plus, students will need to attend 10 hours additional classes per term.
- Student will need to put in approximately 7 hours per week towards self-paced learning and assessment.
